Legislator Scoring System



The first step in developing your legislative campaign is to score the level of support of the legislators in your delegation. It's extremely important that, beyond the two lowest levels of support (opposition and neutrality), every rating must be based on a measureable act you can ask your legislator to do. Having your legislator cosponsor a bill or add something of their campaign website, for example, are measurable acts. Your ratings system then effectively captures your campaign goals: to move legislators up your ratings system by asking them to do the actions on your scorecard that indicate increasing commitment and leadership.

You can use our sample ratings system below, or develop your own based on what you want your legislators to do as they increase their level of support (which is an important organizing question - take your time!).

Sample Legislative Scores

Rating	Support Level	Measurable Action(s)
1	Hostile	Has spoken in opposition to single-payer healthcare
2	Neutral	Not on the record on this issue
3	Leaning Supportive	Is a past co-sponsor, or has spoken publicly in support of single- payer, has supported intermediate legislation (such as a single- payer study bill)
4	Supportive	Current co-sponsor of the legislation
5	Champion	Explains support for single-payer on their campaign website, speaks publicly in favor of single-payer reform, adds name to dear-colleague letter
